The lyrics evolve around the concept of a little girl and her old rag doll. There is a comparison of course - there are new dolls out on the market, better clothes, one that can laugh however the idea is that the little girl has a sentimental attachment for the old rag doll which has essentially seen its day. There is humour and a touch of pathos in the protrayal of the doll.
